Revitalizing NATO for the 21st century

- ✦ The Alliance will adopt a new **Strategic Concept** to guide it for the next decade. It will lay the foundation for a revitalized NATO that is ready to take on the challenges of the 21st century.
- ✦ **Reform** of NATO command structure, agencies and headquarters will create a more agile and more efficient organization.
- ✦ Funding, acquiring, and fielding ten critical **capabilities** is essential to tackling emerging threats. These include:
 - ✦ A territorial **missile defense** capability to protect the territories, populations, and forces of NATO countries.
 - ✦ Cooperation on **cyber security** to detect, prevent, respond to, and recover from cyber attacks.
 - ✦ **Civil-military cooperation** to ensure a comprehensive approach to crises, conflicts, and stabilization and reconstruction.

Demonstrating Progress in Afghanistan

- ✦ The Lisbon Summit will demonstrate that Afghanistan is increasingly responsible for its own security through the transition process.
- ✦ **Transition** will start in the first half of 2011 and will be completed by the end of 2014, which is consistent with the government of Afghanistan's stated goals.
- ✦ The United States urges nations to meet the requirements for **trainers** to enable Afghan security forces to take greater responsibility.
- ✦ NATO has an **enduring commitment** to Afghanistan, which we hope to formalize in a robust and enduring partnership between NATO and Afghanistan.

Resetting the NATO-Russia Relationship

- ✦ Members of the NATO-Russia Council will endorse a Joint Review of common security challenges at the Lisbon Summit to advance cooperation on **Afghanistan, missile defense, counter-terrorism, non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, disaster response, and counter-piracy.**
- ✦ NATO Russia cooperation is based upon reciprocal transparency, a common focus on external threats, crisis management, and mutual respect for the principles of territorial integrity and the indivisibility of security.
